Well, High Noon at Tusco is less than 2 weeks away!! Here are some High Noon Details which you may or may not know:

#### We Open Thursday Morning:

Campers are usually the first folks to show up.

About 100 yards east of the main gate, there is another entrance, closed off by a chain. It is the preferred entrance for RVs and Campers.

Bubba tries to have the chain down by 8 AM, so that campers can get in and set up.

Camping on Tusco Grounds is \$10.00 (total) for Campers/Motorhomes Tent Camping is Free.

<u>Electric is minimal -- You will not be able to power your whole camper with the electric</u> <u>provided.</u>

Electric outlets are on the light poles -- No refunds if you do not get Electric.

Generators will only be allowed between 6am-11pm -- Unless you make arrangements ahead of time.

Please be courteous to fellow campers!

Do not take up more space than you need.

The Range will not be open until Thursday September 26th, 2023, 8am.

There are a number of campgrounds in the surrounding area if you want to arrive earlier in the week.

Thursday is a good day to set up, visit with other shooters, and get ready for Side Match Day on Friday.

The Dawg will get to Tusco in the afternoon, and will have the Shooter's Packets with him. He will set them out on the tables in the lunch area on the range up where we shoot, so mosey up & claim yours.

#### Friday, September 27 is Set Up & Side Match Day!

Friday morning is reserved for setting up the range for High Noon.

Stone Creek Drifter is the Range Boss for set-up.

We appreciate any help you would like to give us, but please get your instructions from Stoney.

Set-up will start as early as we all get there -- Coffee and Doughnuts are appreciated for the set-up crew.

Targets, and props need to be hauled out from the storage sheds, and Stoney will have all

the details on what goes where! We should finish up short of noon, at which time the side matches will begin. <u>There is no food available on Friday, so bring your lunch!</u>

## Friday's Side Match Schedule:

#### Modified Black Powder Plainsman Match Stage 1:

Mandatory Safety Meeting at Noon.

4 Stages hosted by Prairie Dawg and Cheatin Charlie

Requirements:

\*2 Main Match Cap-N-Ball or Cartridge Pistols

\*SASS Legal Single Shot rifle, firing a traditional black powder rifle or pistol caliber cartridge (e. g. not a 30-30)

<0R>

\*Big Bore Lever Rifle (rimmed rifle caliber -- not main match caliber) \*Main Match Shotgun.

\*Rifle can be rifle caliber, lead bullets only. Reduced Loads if you can, so you do not damage our targets.

## Black Powder in all loads!

Each Stage will be 10 Pistol, 6 Rifle, and 4 Shotgun. Plainsman will be 4 stages, so 40 pistol, 24 rifle, and 16 shotgun Bring 4 extra rifle rounds for the bonus targets.

\*All contestants will be entered into a drawing for a pound of Black Powder. Shooters will have a Bonus Target after every stage -- it will be set at the back of the stage. If you hit it, you will get and additional ticket for the powder drawing! \*\*\*\*

#### <u>Cowboy Long Range Side Match -- Stage 2:</u>

#### What is Cowboy long-range precision rifle shooting?

This is a competition where the emphasis is placed on precision shooting at long ranges (Distance Available/Range), with time being a secondary scoring factor. Scoring of these matches at TUSCO is determined by the number of hits and total time used to shoot the required number of shots.

At TUSCO we offer Three Categories in Cowboy Long-Range or Precision Rifle Competition: Lever action, revolver caliber Lever action, rifle caliber Single Shot, rifle caliber

Black-powder categories have been added to all of the basic categories. Each category is competed within itself.

## **Basic rules for the long-range competitions**

- Front barrel sights may vary from simple blades to period hooded wind gauge designs using interchangeable sight inserts and having a spirit level mounted integral with the sight or sight base.
- Rear sights must either be open iron sights mounted on the barrel or original style tang or stock wrist mounted peep sights. Long range rear barrel mounted sights of the flip-up ladder type may use a peephole drilled through the sliding sight leaf. An example of this is the various ladder type sights used on the Springfield trapdoors.
- Bolt or receiver mounted sights are not allowed.
- "Rifle Caliber" competition rifles must use traditional, period, rimmed cartridges. No cartridge chambered for use in any SASS approved main match revolver or rifle may be used in the "Rifle Caliber" competition, except the .56-50. Thus, .30-30 (.30 WCF), .38-55 Marlin & Ballard, .43 Spanish, or .45-70 Government cartridges are legal, while a .375 Winchester, .444 Marlin, .32-20, or .44-40 are not legal. Shotguns using slugs are not allowed.
- Any propellant powder may be used.
- Regardless of category or caliber, bullets used in long range and precision rifle matches must be made of pure lead or lead alloy having a plain base, gas checked, or paper patched configuration.
- Range finders, or any other devices for calculating distances or sight adjustments are not allowed. Their use constitutes a side match disqualification.
- Lever Action Rifles used in long-range matches, whether revolver or rifle calibers, must be originals or replicas of rifles manufactured during the period from approximately 1860 until 1899. Lever or slide action, tubular feed, exposed hammer rifles or carbines are allowed, providing they are in safe working condition.
- Single Shot and Buffalo Single Shot firearms must be originals or replicas of single shot rifles manufactured during the period from approximately 1860 until 1899. All rifles MUST have exposed hammers. The caliber and cartridge rules for the "Rifle Caliber" firearms noted above under basic rules also apply to Single Shot Rifles.

## Single Shot Rifles has two Categories, Traditional or Modern

Basically it's EJECTORS (Modern) vs EXTRACTORS (Traditional)

# *If you hold the gun level and open the action, if the empty casing clears the chamber, it's Modern.*

**Trap doors** because of the complex nature of opening, fall into **Traditional** even though they eject

**Original 1885s** that do not eject are *Traditional* **Rolling Block -** *Traditional* 

Handi rifles with extractor or ejector deactivated *Traditional* Sharps (1874) - *Traditional* 

**Newer 1885s** or Browning 78s fall into *Modern* **Handi rifles** with ejectors *Modern* 

<u>Frontier Lone Rider</u> As per ~ PaleWolf Brunelle ~

Referencing the ATF's illustration for Break Action Firearms, the sight mounted on the rear of the barrel is still mounted on the barrel as the receiver is the part that the barrel is connected to, but not a part of.

So, one can remove the peep sight leaving the base and insert an open leaf sight blade on that base and it will be acceptable/legal.

#### LONG RANGE RIFLE COURSE OF FIRE

**SHOOTER TO START:** Rifle may be shouldered at the Ready Position with a round in the chamber.

FOR LEVER ACTION RIFLES THE MAGAZINE IS LOADED WITH: Revolver Caliber - Rifle Caliber – Single Shot -

#### Shooter will notify the T.O. when ready.

On Signal the Shooter will fire continuously at the target.

The Shooter is not allowed to rest your elbows on the table while Firing.

SHOOTER MAY FIRE COURSE FROM ANY **SAFE FIRING POSITION**; Standing, Sitting, or Prone.

ADDITIONAL ROUNDS FOR SINGLE SHOT TO BE LOADED ON THE CLOCK AND MAY COME FROM THE BODY, POCKETS, LOADING BLOCKS, BELTS, THE TABLE, OR BOXES ETC.

#### ADDITIONAL ROUNDS CANNOT COME FROM ANOTHER INDIVIDUAL OR ANY BODY ORIFICES!
